Organized February 2, 1897. Their engine, the *Warren*, was built in 1859 by Button & Blake, for Roxbury, Mass., and cost \$2,400.

The machine was sold to the town of Ipswich, Mass., in 1864, and was in active service for about thirty-one years. It was finally sold to the Boston Woven Hose and Rubber Co., from whom the Warren V. F. A. secured it, paying \$400 for the old machine, just one-sixth of the original cost.

The engine has attended forty-eight musters with the Warren V. F. A., winning thirty-one prizes as follows: Fourteen firsts, seven seconds, six thirds, one fourth, and one sixth. Total cash won, \$4,777.50.

Best record 238 feet 8½ inches made at East Pepperell, Mass., July 29, 1899. During the forty-eight play-outs with the Warren Vets it has bettered 200 feet on twenty-nine occasions.
