- A. Review Of Draft Minutes Of February 6, 2018

4. Conservation Administrator's Report

- A. Request For Certificate Of Compliance - 44 North Street, 259-775

The berm at R.H. Willson's had been constructed last year, as required by their Stormwater Permit.

The detention basin has now been completed. A letter signed by the engineer stating substantial compliance with the approved plans identified in the Order of Conditions and a set of as-built plans has been received. On a motion from Elliott, seconded by Rand, all
VOTED: to issue a Certificate of Compliance.

- B. Keyes Parker Beaver Deceiver - Replacement

Mike Callahan with Beaver Solutions provided a quote for replacing the beaver deceiver on the dirt access road at Keyes Parker Conservation Areas, which is at end of life. Terrasi will contact Mike and ask if the replacement of the beaver deceiver can wait for a couple of months while the Commission discusses a potential upstream dam removal project with Trout Unlimited, which could determine if the beaver deceiver will be needed.

- C. Environmental Notification Form (ENF) - Robinson Hollow Open Space Residential Development, 110 South Road - Comments Due March 27, 2018

A Request for Comments for an ENF for Robinson Hollow has been received. Comments are due March 27. The project was previously approved but all permits have expired. Once comments for the ENF have been received and reviewed, the engineer for the applicant will submit an Open Space Residential Development to the Planning Board. This project has been downscaled several times and the current proposal includes eight homes. Terrasi stated she has concerns with turtle activity and has spoken with NHESP and the engineer suggesting a turtle plan, with time of year restrictions.

- D. Scout Project Ideas - Den Leader Request For 4th Grade Cub Scouts

Ideas for a group of 4th grade scouts, who are interested in volunteering, were discussed. Trail maintenance was at the top of list with a proposal for scouts to use loppers to open trails. Another thought was for the scouts to remark the Jeff Smith Trail. Terrasi will contact the scout leader.

5. Other Business

Terrasi was asked to follow up on a report of fencing, which is used to contain farm animals, installed at the top of the slope on a property along the Nissitissit River. The property is on Nashua Road. At a minimum, a 15-20' buffer should be provided between the fencing and top of the slope. Terrasi will contact the property owner.
